Immanuel Lutheran Church is linked to Biblical Orthodox Lutheran Mission (BOLM), based in the Rocky Mountain District. BOLM Director Rev. Dr. George Naeem writes, "Our dream has become a reality! BOLM has purchased property to establish the first Lutheran Center for Persecuted Christians. Rev. Naeem and all the missionaries and the teachers on BOLM's staff were praying daily for a place to accommodate the persecuted and needy Christians after coming to Jesus. God has opened the door and a down payment has been made on a foreclosed house. It is in need of some renovation in order to get it ready. The duplex's two units are each equipped with a full kitchen and a full bath. The main items are there, but the house needs updating. We praise God and ask Him to make His face shine upon this home, blessing and protecting all those who will dwell within it. We ask Him to bless those who will teach and learn the Word of God here in this haven."
